

Wilts Horticultural Society



Among the attractive objects at the First Meeting of the *Wilts Horticultural Society*, held on Tuesday at Salisbury, were,- a beautiful little Camellia in most perfect flower, from the conservatory of Dr Fowler, and a pretty specimen of the *Acacia affinis* (which has been in full flower for some time past in the open ground), cultivated by the Rev. S. Heathcott, at Bramshaw, the seed of which was sent from New South Wales to this country by a son of William Wyndham, esq., of Dinton, in this country; the plant itself has now attained the height of 15 feet.
