## Dinton

## Committed to Fisherton Gaol

This particular gaol was built between 1818 & 1822 on the east side of the Devizes Road, Salisbury just beyond the junction with Wilton Road and was closed in 1870. The building was demolished from 1875 except for the central block and acquired by Dr William Corbin Finch, the proprietor of the Fisherton House Lunatic Asylum and named Radnor House.

Barnes	James	Charged with having feloniously stolen a silver watch, the property of William Jarvis, at Dinton.  *Outcome – Imprisonment with hard labour – 6 months	Salisbury & Winchester Journal 8 <sup>th</sup> April, 1839
Blake	James	Of Dinton, for poaching.  *Outcome – one month imprisonment	Salisbury & Winchester Journal 9 <sup>th</sup> September, 1843
Yates	Henry	Of Dinton, for trespass in pursuit of game.  *Outcome – one month imprisonment	Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette 26 <sup>th</sup> October, 1843
Humphries	Fanny	Of Dinton, for stealing part of a dead fence.  *Outcome – one month imprisonment	Salisbury & Winchester Journal 16 <sup>th</sup> December, 1843
Druit	Diana	Of Dinton, for leaving her children chargeable to the parish. *Outcome –14 days imprisonment	Salisbury & Winchester Journal 17 <sup>th</sup> May, 1845
Rudge	Thomas	Of Dinton, charged with stealing four half-crowns and other monies, the property of John Beavant	Salisbury & Winchester Journal 30th August, 1845
