Dinton-cum-Teffont Magna

Dinton is a township, village and parish, 9 miles west from Salisbury station, 74 from London, 7 east from Hindon and 6 west from Wilton, in the Hundred of Warminster, Wilton Union, Salisbury bishopric, South Wilts, situated on the river Nadder. It is known as the birth-place of the celebrated Lord Clarendon. The living is a vicarage, comprehending the chapelry of Teffont Magna, value £375, with 40 acres 2 Roods 20 Poles of glebe land, in the gift of Magdalen College, Oxford. The vicarial tithes belong to the living; the rectorial tithes belong partly to Magdalen College, and partly to the Dean and Canons of Windsor, and about 10 acres of glebe to the latter. The Rev. James Charles Stafford, B.D. incumbent. The church, which is in the early English style, and decorated, is built in the form of a cross, with a square tower rising from the centre, with 6 fine-toned bells. The population, in 1851, was 538; there are about 2,400 acres. Lord Pembroke is lord of the manor.

MARSHWOOD HOUSE is half a mile north.

TEFFONT MAGNA is a township, parish and village, in the Hundred of Warminster, Hindon division, Tisbury Union, South Wilts, in the diocese of Sarum, situated on the turnpike road leading from Salisbury to Hindon, 10 miles west of Salisbury, and 5 east of Hindon, immediately adjoining the parish of Teffont Evias; it contains 1,646 acres of arable and pasture land, and 281 inhabitants; in parochial matters this is a separate parish, but for ecclesiastical purposes it is annexed, and pays an annual rent-charge of £339 3s. to the adjoining parish of Dinton, from which it is rather more than a mile distant. The chapel of ease, standing on the north of the village, is an ancient structure, built with stone; has neither tower nor chancel, and lately underwent a thorough repair. The living is a chapelry in the patronage of the rector of Dinton; the present incumbent is the Rev. James Charles Stafford, B.D., of Dinton. William Wyndham, Esq.,, of Dinton House, is lord of the manor.
