COLONEL WILLIAM BURLTON C.B. Dedicated this tablet To the Memory of his two eldest sons Who were amongst the earliest of the victims of the Great Revolt of the Bengal Native Army in the year 1857 The eldest FRANCIS MOIRA HASTINGS Captain Commandant of the 2nd Regiment of Cavalry in the Gwalior Contingent (North Western Province of India) From the effects of exposure and fatigue in the zealots discharge of his duty against the rebels. On the 13th day of July 1857, aged 37 years and 4 months. The second PHILIP HAWTREY COMYN Lieutenant in the 67th Bengal Native Infantry, was basely murdered by a party of his Regiment employed as a Treasurer escort under his command. At Muttra. (In the vicinity of the scene of his elder brother's death) on the 30th day of may 1857, aged 26 years and 6 months. They were Good sons,gallant soldiers, and honourable men, and having acted well, their allotted parts in life, they leave behind them a memory deserving of respect and an example worthy of imitation.</p> |
| Burleton | Sarah | <p style="text-align: center;">Sacred to the Memory of SARAH Relict of WILLIAM BURLETON of Wyken Hall, Leicestershire Esq^{re}. who died in this parish where she had resided during a long widowhood on the 30th November 1843, aged 71. deeply and universally lamented Her remains were interred in the Church Yard of Cann S^t. Rumbold Shaftesbury Beside those of her brother Charles Bowles Esq^{re}. This tablet is erected as a small tribute of affection and gratitude to a much loved mother by her three surviving children</p> |

Bombay N.I. Who died at Dhoolia, in the East Indies Dec^r. 24. 1845, aged 34 years Frances, who died May 12, 1854 aged 57 years and Maria Jane, who died August 6, 1864 Aged 55 years.</p> |
| Jackson | William Henry | <p style="text-align: center;">To the Memory of Major WILLIAM HENRY JACKSON of the 12th Reg^t. Bombay N.I. Son of the late Rev^d. Gilbert Jackson, D.D. Rector of this parish, and Bathia his wife, who, in the engagement at Meeanee, near Hydrabad in Scinde after evining the most consummate bravery fell, covered with glory, on the 17th of Feb^{ry}, 1843, aged 39 years. This tablet was erected by the voluntary contributions of the parishioners of his native village, In admiration of the heroic courage as a British Officer, as a mark of respect to his bereaved family, and to perpetuate to posterity his many and rare virtues.</p> |
