Nut Picking Case Dismissed

Damaging Underwood

Ann Warner, Ann Martin, and Mary Ann Martin, were charged with having damaged underwood by picking nuts, in Loosehanger Copse, the property of Earl Radnor.

George Pilgrim, a keeper, who appeared in support of the charge, admitted that he did not see the damage done, but said he had taken a quantity of nuts away from the defendants.

The Bench said there was no evidence before them that the defendants had done the damage, and the case was therefore dismissed.
