

Trouble at the Kings Head, Redlynch

Salisbury, County Petty Sessions, Tuesday. Before Mr E. Hinxman, Sir F.H. H. Bathurst, Bart., Mr M. H. Marsh, Mr J. Goff, Mr G. M. Fort, and Mr G. Morrison.

John Tanner, Jesse Tanner, Mark Harris, Thomas Pretty and Esau Pretty were fined 5s each and costs, for being drunk and riotous at the King's Head Inn, Redlynch, on the night of Saturday, 24th ult.

Samuel Chalke, the landlord of the King's Arms, Redlynch, was summoned for knowingly permitting drunkenness and fighting in his house on the night of Saturday 24th ult. P.C. Hillier stated that he heard quarrelling and fighting in the defendant's house at 12 o'clock on the night in question. As many as 20 persons (amongst them the prisoners in the last case) came out of the house, most of whom were the worse for liquor. Defendant was ordered to pay 40s and costs; in default, 14 days [in prison].
