

## Kellys Directory Extract 1867 Durnford



**DURNFORD** is a parish and village, in the Southern division of the county, hundred and union of Amesbury, petty sessional division of Salisbury and Amesbury, Salisbury county court district, rural deanery of Amesbury, archdeaconry of Sarum, and diocese of Salisbury, and within the parliamentary borough of Wilton, 21/2 miles south from Amesbury, 6 north from Salisbury, and 89 miles from London, pleasantly situated in the vale of Avon, on the east side of the river. The church of St Andrew is an ancient structure, in the Early English style, with square tower containing 5 bells; it has a nave and chancel. The register dates from 1574. The living is a vicarage, gross yearly value £149, including 30 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held by the Rev. John Newton Hinxman M.A. of Trinity College, Oxford. The old rectory was formerly occupied by James Harris, the author of "Hermes". Here is a chapel for Wesleyans. Durnford Manor House, one of the seats of the Earl of Malmesbury, is situated here, now occupied by J. Pinckney Esg. Durnford was a Roman settlement.

At Little Durnford, 3 miles north from Salisbury, is the mansion and estate of Edward Hinxman Esq. The Earl of Malmesbury is lord of the manor of Great Durnford. James Swayne esq. of Wilton, Edward Hinxman esq. of Little Durnford, and Thomas Staples esq. of Alderbury are the chief landowners. Ogbury camp is close by, and there are many barrows. The chief crops are wheat, barley, and oats. In 1861 the population was 554, the acreage 3,423.

**NETTON** is a hamlet, one mile south, where there is a National school; Salterton hamlet, (or Salteston), 2 south, Newton hamlet,  $2^{1}/_{2}$  miles south, Normanton hamlet 2 miles north.

**Post Office:** George Rumbold, receiver. Letters through Salisbury, arrive at 7 a.m. & dispatched at 6 p.m.; Sundays, 10.30 a.m. The nearest money order office is at Amesbury.
