LEAVING SERVICE

William Hillier of Enford, was committed to the House of Corrections, Devizes for 6 weeks for leaving the service of Mr Clift of Durrington.

MISDEMEANOUR IN SERVICE

Thomas Chandler was committed to the House of Corrections, Devizes for 6 weeks for a misdeameanour in the service of Job Mead of Durrington.

MISBEHAVIOUR IN SERVICE

Henry Weeks and Henry Thomas, of Durrington were both committed to Fisherton Gaol for three weeks each, for misbehavior in the service of James Hayden.

MISCONDUCT IN SERVICE

Richard Wesdell was committed to New Prison, Devizes for fourteen days for misconduct in the service of Stephen Chandler at Durrington.

LEAVING SERVICE

Michael Merrett was committed to the New Prison Devizes for one month, for leaving the service of Stephen Chandler at Durrington.

LEAVING SERVICE

John Cooper was sentenced to ten days' imprisonment for leaving the service of Mr Charles Kellow, of Durrington.

LEAVING SERVICE

Joseph Marshall appeared in County Petty Sessions to answer to information charging him with leaving the service of Mr Miles, of Durrington. Mr E. E. P. Kelsey appeared for the defence, and contended that there was no proof of a yearly hiring. The Bench dismissed the information.
