On the 22nd inst., the Lord Bishop of this Diocese licensed the Rev. Richard Webb, M.A., to the perpetual curacy of Durrington, in this county, void by the resignation of Henry Fowle, clerk, on the nomination of the Dean and Chapter of Winchester.

On Saturday morning, the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Salisbury licensed the Rev. Charles Snelling Ruddle, clerk, to the Perpetual Curacy of Durrington, Wilts, void by the death of the Rev. Richard Webb, clerk, the last incumbent thereof, on the nomination of the Dean and Chapter of Winchester.

DIOCESE OF SALISBURY

The Bishop of Salisbury has collated the Rev. Storer Marshall Lakin, M.A., minor canon of Salisbury Cathedral, to the Succentorship vacant by the resignation of the Rev. H. T. Armfield. His Lordship has appointed the Rev. Canon Morrice, vicar of St. Thomas Salisbury, to be rural dean of Wilton, in Wilts, vice the Rev. Canon Payne, resigned; the Rev. C. S. Ruddle, vicar of Durrington, to be dean of the second portion of Amesbury deanery, vice the Rev. J. N. Peili, deceased.
