EMIGRATION TO NEW ZEALAND FREE GRANTS OF LAND 40 TO 400 ACRES AND UPWARDS

Every industrious man of good character, (and not, through age, infirmity, or other cause, unlikely to form a useful Colonist) emigrating at his own expense to the province of Auckland, New Zealand, will, on approval, receive a *Free Grant of Forty Acres of good Land* in the colony, together with *Forty Acres more for each person above 18 years, and Twenty Acres for each child above 5 and under 18 years of age*, whom he may take with him at his expense, to the colony.

The emigrant chooses the land himself in any of the surveyed districts, either immediately on his arrival in the colony or at any time within five years after, and he may either enter on possession at once, or work at his trade in any part of the province till he has acquired experience of the colony and saved money, to clear and cultivate his own farm.

The parties eligible are agricultural labourers and servants, mechanics of various kinds, domestic servants, (male and female), and farmers of small capital, or other parties able to employ labour, or in any way advance the interests of the colony.

Where a considerable number of persons may desire to emigrate in a body, and form a small community in the province, the Provincial Government will favour such a community, by endeavouring to provide superior lands and an advantageous location. The agent will be happy to communicate with any parties desiring to form such a community.

Forms of application sent post free. Full information as to the land regulations, cost of clearing and cultivating land, rates of labour, &c., may be had by applying personally, or by letter, to Joseph Newman, Esq., agent for the Provincial Government of Auckland, No. 10, Drury Buildings, Water Street, Liverpool.

Mr Newman was for sixteen years a resident in New Zealand, as a farmer, and member of the Provincial Council of Auckland.
