

**Durrington** is a parish and village on the river Avon, in the Southern division of the county, Amesbury hundred and union, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and rural deanery of Amesbury second portion, 2 miles north from Amesbury, 6 from Porton station on South Western railway and 10 north from Salisbury.

The church of All Saints consists of chancel, nave and aisles; the south aisle is Norman; the church was rebuilt in 1851, with the exception of the tower, which is Perpendicular; the remainder is in the Early English style; a Norman arcade has been retained: there are four beautiful memorial windows to the late rector, the Rev. R. Webb, M.A. The register dates from the year 1591. The living is a rectory, yearly value about £300, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Winchester, and held by the Rev. Charles Snelling Ruddle T.A., of King's College, London, rural dean of the second portion of Amesbury deanery. Allen's charity is 20s. yearly.

On the downs are many barrows, among which is Knighton Long Barrow. To the south is the great British station called Durrington Walls.

The manor is held by the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, and the East End manor is held by Sir E. Poore, bart., and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners. The principal landowners are Mrs Fowle and George Pearce Moore, esq.

The soil is light and chalky; subsoil, chalk; the chief crops are wheat, barley and oats; the area is 2,682 acres; rateable value £2,897; the population in 1871 was 420.
