Durrington

The Quarterly Meeting of the Salisbury Diocesan Board of Education was attended on Tuesday last by the Lord Bishop, Rev. M. King, Rev. C. Morgell, the Venerable Archdeacon Hony, the Venerable Archdeacon MacDonald, Hon. and Rev. Canon Bouverie, Rev. R. Webb, Rev. Prebendary Smart, Rev. Prebendary Moore, Rev. H. Caswell, Rev. Talbot Baker, Rev. J. Wilkinson, Rev. W. Biscoe, Rev. W. Buller, Rev. J. Fraser, and the Secretary. J. Carter, of Warminster, was elected to the vacant Exhibition in the School at Salisbury for mistresses. The Board desired their Secretary to write to Mr Baker, an organizing master of the National Society, to express to him their entire satisfaction with the way in which he had discharged the important duties intrusted to him in the Training School between August and Christmas in the last year. The Secretary reported that the following pupil teachers had obtained Queen Scholarships in the School; - 1st Class – A. Fifield (a Queen Scholar of 1851). M. A. Grey (Warminster), R. J. Smith (Durrington), E. Spreadbury (Durrington); 2nd Class – E. Kimber (Combe), H. Wyatt (Warminster).....
