






The Australian General Postmasters Department gave no objection to Herbert Miller being enrolled for Active Service.	
Herbert Robert Miller requested in his Will, dated 8th October, 1916, that all his property & effects be given to Mrs. M. Miller of Grey Street, Traralgon, Victoria.	
He was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll & Plaque were sent to Herbert's father
