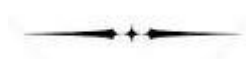
M. Mulvey was born around 1903.

Private M. Mulvey died on 2nd February, 1919.

A death for James Mulvey, aged 16, was registered in the March quarter, 1919 in the district of Amesbury, Wiltshire, England.

Private M. Mulvey was buried in Durrington Cemetery, Wiltshire in Grave /Plot Number 362 on 8th February, 1919 under the name of James Mulvey. His death is acknowledged by Commonwealth War Graves Commission & as such he has a CWGC headstone but he does not have a personal inscription on his headstone.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission lists Private M. Mulvey 35022 as being attached to 4th Battalion, Royal Irish Regiment. No additional family information is listed.



4th Battalion, Royal Irish Regiment

The 4th Battalion, Royal Irish Regiment was an Extra Reserve Battalion & was raised in Kilkenny in August, 1914. The Battalion was a training Unit & it remained in the UK throughout the War. It moved within a few days of declaration of war to Queenstown. In May, 1915 the Battalion moved to England & was based at Gosport. They returned to Ireland in September, 1915 and moved to Fermoy. In May, 1916, the battalion moved to back to Queenstown. In April, 1918 the Battalion moved to England and joined the Irish Reserve Brigade at Larkhill, near Durrington, Wiltshire.
