## St Mary's Church

Some people have asked why we have a Patron Saint and in particular why our Church in East Knoyle should be graced with the link to St Mary. The custom can be traced back to the building of churches over the tombs of martyrs in former times. However Patron Saints may be chosen for a variety of reasons; for example, maybe a church was founded on a particular Saint's day. It would be interesting to know why St Mary was chosen for East Knoyle, and just how far back this can be traced, but the records are fairly sketchy and it is not possible to provide a definitive answer. St Mary's Feast Day falls on 15<sup>th</sup> August, according to the Anglican Church calendar, so traditionally we have a celebration on the nearest Sunday, which this year is 20<sup>th</sup> August, (well not quite the nearest, but the 13<sup>th</sup> happens to be Lammass!)

Turning to another recent cause for celebration, after Matins on the 9<sup>th</sup> July we presented Suzanne Sandford with a lovely engraved vase to mark her many years of service to the Church. The vase shows an etching of the Church, surrounded by various wild flowers. It was accompanied by a cheque donated by the many generous villagers, past as well as present, so that Suzanne and Chris can also select a range of garden furniture of their choice: we hope they will enjoy these mementoes, after both serving St Mary's so loyally and effectively for so many years.



Two other happy events have occurred recently. Another anniversary has passed and the new updated shop has delivered all that we hoped. Our takings are back up and the range of products we stock or can order for you has increased. The refit has been a great success and highly praised by villagers, friends and visitors alike. We are in a much more robust place than at any time in the last 11 years of operation.

We don't and can't rest on our laurels however, we need volunteers; openers/closers, till and non-till people to ensure that we can continue to give the community the continued village shop operation we all enjoy. It is fun and a great way of meeting fellow members of our community.

We had a successful AGM in May. The accounts have been signed off for 2016. We made a small loss, but that was due to our increased refit costs and investment in new equipment. Our wastage, with the new shop layout and improved storage, has decreased and the overheads, due to more efficient equipment and lighting, are greatly reduced which is fantastic news for the future.

The shop continues to increase our **discount offerings** for pre-ordered items. We currently offer a 5% discount on our Prime Cuts meats and fruit & veg, which is delivered daily (Mon – Sat) alongside great deals on pet food with only an approximate 10% mark-up on wholesale prices if pre-ordered. So, why not plan ahead and save money throughout the year. We also offer “whole case discounts” on any food or household cupboard items that you pre-order from us. This will save £s on your shopping bill – keeping your shopping both local and good value.

If there are any of our **younger villagers** who want some volunteer shop experience over the summer holiday, please do not hesitate to contact Janeen. Also to anyone out there with some spare time, we'd love to have you come and sign up for 1 or 2 (or more) hours a week.

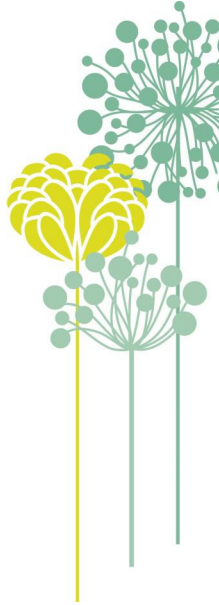

## Knole Knature Notes

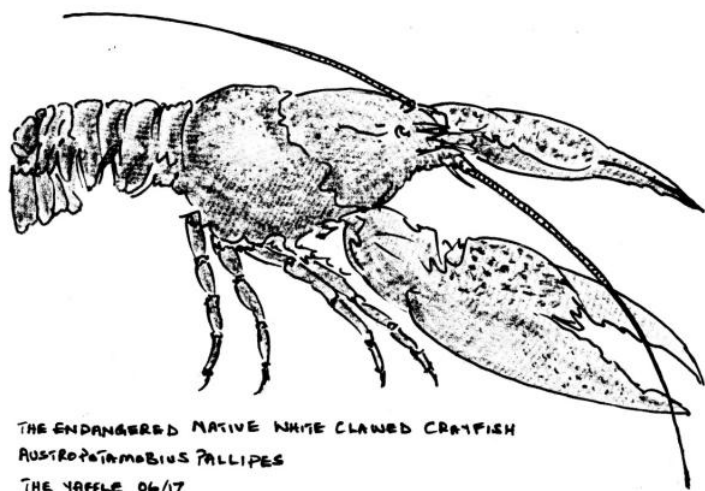
There's surely no greater evocation of summer in England than the lingering scent of new mown hay on a warm afternoon breeze. That intoxicating, aromatic mix of meadowsweet with hints of tobacco, leather, vanilla pod and fresh dried linen.

A good year for glow worms, which are actually beetles. The female emits a vivid greenish yellow glow as bright as an LED indicator from the lower two sections of her underbody as she positions herself body pointed upwards to attract flying males.

Unfortunately this season's 'late to leaf' Ash is in some cases evidence of the spread of Ash dieback. The spore borne disease spreads fastest where there are close concentrations of the tree. On a more positive note, growth of Elms to 30 feet or more that are hitherto unaffected by Dutch Elm disease continues to be noted. An exceptionally tall Hawthorn has been noted in woodland on Sandpit Hill, at over 11 meters tall, it's approximate height and girth will be recorded with the Tree Register. See [www.treeregister.org](http://www.treeregister.org) and go to non-members for British tree records.

Robins are starting to leave their garden sanctuaries, after rearing their broods. The Spotted Flycatcher returned in late May, entertaining us with swooping dives and loops between perches, whilst above Swallows and House Martins gorge themselves on the swarms of summer insects. It's been a prolific year for Bullfinches, with many pairs of these beautifully marked birds sighted in and around the Parish, usually given away by their white tail bars as they dive into a hedge.

The heat brought with it from the continent, an influx of the migratory Painted Lady butterfly, also the occasional Swallowtail with it's bold, strong flight and exquisite colouring. Meadow Browns in abundance, with the less frequent, beautifully marked Speckled Wood. On woodland walks keep your eyes open for the magnificent, large, Purple Emperor butterfly. The Yaffle has yet to see or hear of a local sighting ; you are most likely to see one settled on fox scat (or dog pooh!) in a woodland clearing.



The prospect of a trip to the coast during the heatwave, in nightmarish traffic, was quickly exchanged for a mill pool visit on the Avon in the Woodford valley north of Salisbury. A childhood spent in the area would have seen us catch a dozen of the indigenous White Clawed crayfish in no time. Those days have sadly gone as crayfish plague, pollution and aggressive introduced species wreaked havoc with the native population which is now endangered. On entering the pool for a dip, the water was still wonderfully cooling, but diminished water clarity and a bottom coating of slimy brown algae, bear testament to the long term effects that the runoff from fertilisers is having on these once pristine southern chalk streams and rivers.

### East Knole Rainfall (from Robin Egerton)



Rainfall recorded - May = 83mm (3.27") / June = 52.25mm (2.06")

What a difference a month makes, Mays' rainfall coming in above my 'May' average of 2.73". Rainfall was recorded on 11 days in May with the highest rainfall in a day being 1.06" on the 17th. The longest spell without rain recorded was 9 consecutive days.

June was slightly drier than my average for June of 2.34", with rainfall recorded on only 10 days, and a spell of 15 consecutive days without rainfall recorded. These two months bring the half yearly total up to 13.91" so-far, compared with 19.69" at the same time last year.

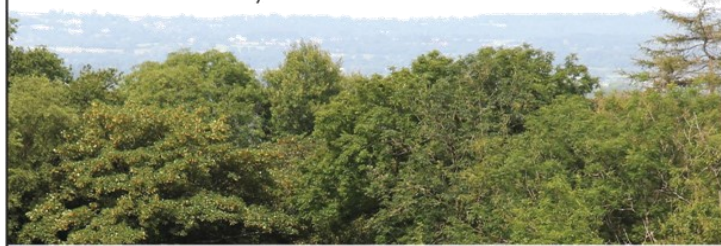

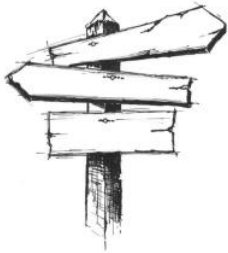

### Business

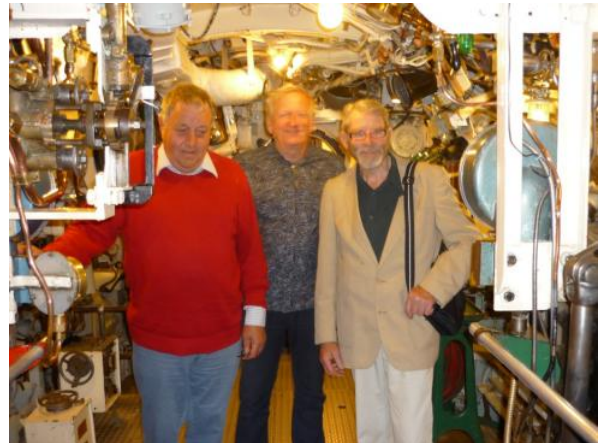

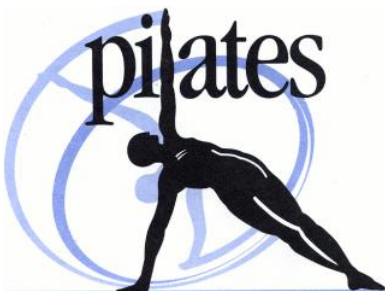

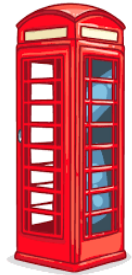

### Help the NHS – and yourself

In 2010 the NHS was funded at the same level as equivalent European economies, but now the gap between us and these countries is over £40 billion. We therefore need to be more realistic about what the NHS can provide and think about how we use NHS resources.

#### Some suggestions:

Turn up for appointments. Nationally last year 7% of patients did not attend their first appointment for physiotherapy. In Hindon, 21% patients in the same period didn't bother to turn up and didn't contact the hospital to cancel. This waste of resources adds to ever lengthening waiting times. Please don't ask for a referral you don't intend to go to, and cancel as soon as you know you no longer need an appointment. We always call patients who don't appear for appointments at the surgery, but it helps if you can cancel it if you don't need it to allow someone else to be seen. We have about a dozen patients who frequently book appointments and then don't turn up. However 99.5% do book and turn up every time.

See the right service – patients still go to A&E during normal working hours with a problem they could and should see the GP about. In this area of Wiltshire all the small practices can see patients quickly if you contact us and ask to be seen.

Don't order medication if you don't need it – we still get a lot of medication returned that we have to throw away.

Take up invitations to screening services without being reminded. Early detection of problems is good for you as well as being cheaper - a bowel cancer found at screening costs about £10000 to treat and has a 90–95% survival rate at five years. Not being screened and being diagnosed with symptoms has a 5-10% survival at five years and the care costs £30,000.

Please do your bit to help your NHS – help to save the money where you can so there is some left for when (and if) you really need it.

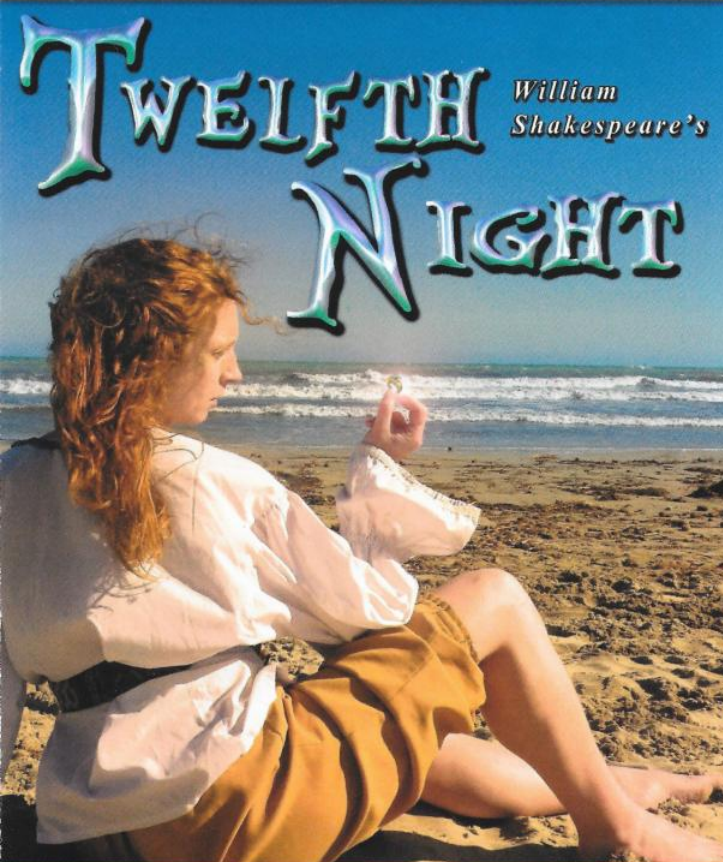
