



The WOPC has transcribed below the text of an article published in the Wiltshire Telegraph on 29 August 1914.

This article followed the publication the previous week - on 22 August 1914 - of a similar list, by parish, of all known Wiltshire men serving in His Majesty's Forces at the time. (The lists of names from 22 August 1914 may be found in separate documents on the relevant Wiltshire OPC (WOPC) website parish pages.

The extract below only contains the names of additional serving men associated with this parish. The list of additional serving men from other Wiltshire parishes may be found on the other relevant WOPC parish pages.

The list of additional serving men and associated information from the article has been tabulated in alphabetical order by surname. The lists are of men SERVING at the time and were headlined as a "Roll of Honour".
