Edington



Edington is a parish in the Northern division of the county, hundred of Whorwelsdown, Westbury union and county court district, Salisbury diocese, Wilts archdeaconry and Potterne rural deanery, situated 3³/₄ miles north-east from Westbury station, 6 south-east from Trowbridge, and 113 from London.

The church of St Mary, St Katharine and All Saints is a magnificent cruciform structure, in the Transition style, being partly Decorated and partly Perpendicular. It has a fine tower rising from the centre, containing 6 bells, a lofty south porch, and nave, divided from the aisles by six lofty arches on each side, with as many clerestory windows above. There is a south stained window of three lights to the memory of Mrs Elizabeth Mayne, and there are some very handsome monuments, both ancient and modern; among them is a fine group by Sir F Chantrey, representing the death-bed of Sir Simon R B Taylor, bart. The eastern and western windows are also magnificent. The register dates from 1695. The living is a vicarage. The vicar's income amounts with fees to £160 per annum, in the gift of Simon Watson Taylor, esq., and held by the Rev. Samuel Littlewood, B.D., of St John's College, Cambridge.

There is a school in connection with the church, for infants and for boys and girls. It has no endowment and is supported by subscription and small fees from the scholars.

Simon Watson Taylor, esq. is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is green sand; subsoil, chalk with some clay. The chief crops are wheat and pasture, and there are numerous apple orchards.

The population in 1871 was 1,032, including its adjuncts, and the parish extends over an area of 5,705 acres; gross estimated rental, £8,212; rateable value, £7,355.

West Coulston tithing is 2 miles east; Tinhead tithing, half a mile north-east; Baynton is one mile east.
