

Men Stole Machine Parts

Thomas Woradell was charged with stealing some brass bearings belonging to a thrashing machine, the property of Mr Richard Kilmister, of Enford Farm, on the 24th December last. He was committed for trial at the next assizes.

John Pike, late engine driver in the employ of Mr Richard Kilmister, was charged with stealing a brass socket from a machine, the property of his master, on the 24th December. He was also charged with stealing a gutta percha driving band from a steam thrashing machine, also the property of his master, on the 14th January last. He was committed for trial at the assizes upon both charges.
