## Fifield Bavant

**Fifield Bavant** is a parish in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Chalke, Wilton union, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, rural deanery of Chalke and Salisbury county court district, a mile and a half west from Broad Chalke and 10 miles south-west from Salisbury.

The church of St Martin is very small, consisting of nave only. The register dates from 1610. The living is a rectory, yearly value £150, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath, and held by the Rev. Tupper Carey, M.A., of Christ Church, Oxford, vicar of Ebbesbourne Wake.

The Marquis of Bath is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is chalk; subsoil, same. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats.

The area is 1,143 acres; gross estimated rental, £918; rateable value, £832; the population in 1871 was 62.
