



Prison Visitor to go to Gaol

Caution

On Tuesday last, Rebecca Wild, who has for many years past been in the habit of visiting the debtors in Fisherton Gaol, in order to furnish them with necessary articles of provision, was convicted before the county Magistrates of having introduced ardent spirits into the prison, in direct contravention of the Act of Parliament, and sentenced to pay the full penalty of £20, in default of which she was committed to the House of Correction, Devizes, for the term of three months. It is a somewhat singular circumstance, that on the above day twelvemonth a person of the name of Wm. Moore was convicted of a similar offence, and fined £10, a sum which he accordingly paid.
