


Roll of Honour WWI Fisherton Delamere



BACON, JOHN A. - Private 4999 - 2nd/8th Battalion Royal Warwickshire Regiment - Died 20th August 1916 - Aged 34 - Born in Bapton - Son of Frank & Fanny Bacon of Bapton, Fisherton Delamere; Brother of Amy, William & Charles Bacon; Employed as a carter on a farm - Has no known grave and is commemorated on the Loos Memorial, Pas De Calais, France, Panel 22-25. Also commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book.



DOUGHTY, JESSE - Private 22228 - 3rd Battalion Wiltshire Regiment transferred to (431301) 447th Agricultural Company, Labour Corps - Died 16th December 1918 at home - Aged 22 - Born in Bapton - Son of George (deceased) & Fanny Doughty of Bapton, Fisherton Delamere; Brother of William, James, Charles, Albert, Nellie, Frederick, Polly & Mabel Doughty; Employed as a shepherd - Buried at St. Nicholas Churchyard, Fisherton Delamere. Also commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book.



GALE, ALPHONSO CECIL - Private 26651 - 8th Battalion Somerset Light Infantry - Died 28th April 1917 - Aged 18 - Born in Bapton; Resident of Horsington, Somerset - Grandson of Thomas & Elizabeth Gale of The Dairy, Bapton, Fisherton Delamere; Brother of Henry Cyril Gale; Listed in the 1911 census as a 12 year old scholar - Has no known grave and is commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas De Calais, France, Bay 4. Also commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book

JOHNSON, ALBERT E. - Commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book - There is no other defining information for this casualty. - Possibly Albert Frank Johnson of Chilmark serving with the Wiltshire Regiment as he is listed in the Memorial Book as A. F. Johnson.

JONES, EDWARD - Commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book - There is no other defining information for this casualty. - Possibly Charles Edward Jones born in Newport, Monmouthshire and resident of Codford St. Mary since he is listed in the Memorial books as C. E. Jones

KENT, EDWARD - Private PO/1540/S - Royal Marine Light Infantry - Died 2nd February 1919 at Royal Naval Hospital, Haslar, Gosport, Hampshire of Pneumonia - Age 30 - Born in Coxwells, Berkshire - Son of John & Agnes Kent of Bapton, Fisherton Delamere; Brother of Thomas, Harry, Florence, Annie, Rose, Joseph, Alfred & Ernest Kent; Employed as a farm labourer - Buried at St. Nicholas Churchyard, Fisherton Delamere. Also commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book



MOWLAND, WALTER E. - Commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book - There is no other defining information for this casualty. - Possibly Walter Mowlan born in Downton and resident of Salisbury although both the memorial and book has the surname as Mowlan.

WRIGHT, WILLIAM J. - Commemorated on the Fisherton Delamere War Memorial and in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book - There is no other defining information for this casualty
