1820

Married - Mr William Hitchcock of Fittleton to Miss Baden, eldest daughter of the late Andrew Baden, esq of Longstreet Hall, Wilts. Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette Thursday 11 March1820

1822

On the 17th ult was married at Fittleton Mr Pearce to Miss Parratt of Cholston Farm. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 4 November 1822

1827

On Monday the 26th ult was married at North Tidworth, Mr John Blackmore of Fittleton, to Miss Elizabeth Joules of the former place. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 19 March 1827

On Saturday morning died at Beaches Barn, Fittleton, Mr William Smith. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 6 August 1827

Tuesday last died at Huxton, in the parish of Fittleton in this county, Mr William Griffin Pearce, in his 83rd year. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 29 October 1827

Married on Thursday last at Ilfracombe, by the Rev. St. Vincent Bowen, the Rev. Roger Hitchcock of Fittleton, Wilts, to Miss Gibbons of Stanwell, Middlesex sister to Sir John Gibbons of Stanwell Place, Staines. **North Devon Journal Thursday 22 November 1827**

1840

Died in the eighty seventh year of his age, the Rev. John Parkinson, D.D., of Ravendale, near Grimsby, fifty five years Rector of Brocklesby, Lincolnshire, and forty three years Rector of Fittleton, Wilts. **Essex Standard Friday 11 September 1840**

1841

Died May 15 at Longparish, in her 92nd year, Mrs Ann Morris, daughter of the late Mr John Compton of Beeches Barn, Fittleton, Wilts. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 31 May 1841

1842

Died on Tuesday last at his residence in Fittleton, the Rev. Thomas Horner South, aged 80. He was seventeen years Curate of the parish, and for more than twenty years Curate of the parishes of Broad Chalke, Bower Chalke and also of Teffont, in this county. Mr. South was extensively known and very much respected through a long life. He was a descendant of the family of Horner, of Mells, Somersetshire, and also of the noble house of Ilchester.

Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 3 January 1842

July 1, at Ravensdale near Grimsby, Lincolnshire by the Rev. Woodthorp Johnson A.M., The Rev. John P. Wilson, Fellow of Magdalen College, Oxford to Mary only daughter of the late Rev. J. Parkinson D.D, Rector of Brocklesby, in the same county, and of Fittleton in Wiltshire.

Died on the 5th inst at Gibraltar, deeply lamented by her family, Sarah, the wife of Major D. E. Johnson of the 5th Fusiliers, and sister of Mr Bates of Fittleton.

Died December 5 at her son's residence, Fittleton, Wilts, most sincerely and deeply lamented by her family, Ann, widow of the late Isaac Bates of Kennington, Surrey.

Married on Tuesday the 4th inst, at Osmington Church, Dorset, by the Rev. W. T. Phillips B.D., Rector of Fittleton, Wilts, the Rev. Henry Jones B.A., St John's College, Cambridge, eldest son of the Rev. Charles Jones, Vicar of Pakenham, Suffolk, to Emily Fonblanque eldest daughter of the Rev. James Evans Phillips, Vicar of Osmington, a member of the second branch of the family of Sir John Phillipps of Picton Castle, county of Pembroke, created Baronet in 1621. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Saturday 8 January 1848

Married on the 19th inst at Fittleton church, Wilts, by the Rev. M. Heon Maxwell, Vicar of Frampton, Dorset, Charles Stuart Harris, esq. of Budleigh Salterton, Devon to Catherine Jane, youngest daughter of the late Major Vowell of the 88th Regiment of Foot.
