

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Fonthill Bishop



FONTHILL BISHOP (or Bishop's Fonthill) is a village and parish 3 miles north from the Tisbury station on the Salisbury and Yeovil branch of the London and South Western railway, 14 west from Salisbury and 10 north-east from Shaftesbury, in the Southern division of the county, Downton hundred, Tisbury petty sessional division and union, Shaftesbury county court district, Chalke rural deanery, (Tisbury portion), archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury. The church of All Saints is a cruciform edifice of stone, originally in the Norman style, and consisting of chancel, nave, transepts, and a central tower containing 2 bells; in 1871 the chancel was rebuilt at the expense of the Rev. R W Sheldon MA, rector 1866-92, and the whole church was thoroughly restored in 1879 at the cost of Thomas Sheldon esq of Clevedon, his brother, Mr Wyatt, being the architect: there are 125 sittings. The register dates from the year 1754. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £180, including 4.5 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Oxford, and held since 1914 by the Rev. Richard Wilton Sutcliffe MA of St John's College, Oxford. There is a small charity, dispensed by the rector and churchwardens. The Bishop of Winchester is lord of the manor. Hugh Morrison esq DL, JP is principal landowner. The soil is chalky loam, sub-soil, chalk and stone. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats, and some land is in pasturage; the area is 1797 acres, rateable £803: the population in 1911 was 137.
