Great Chalfield (Little Chalfield & Cottles)



LITTLE CHALFIELD and COTTLES, formerly extra-parochial, in the Western division of the county, hundred, petty sessional division, union and county court district of Bradford, 3 miles north from Bradford, about 2 north-west from Holt station, on the Wilts and Somerset branch of the Great Western railway, 4 west from Melksham, and 9 east from Bath. In March 1885, by Local Government Board Order, Little Chalfield and Cottles were added to Atworth for civil purposes. The inhabitants of these places attend the churches at Great Chalfield and Atworth. The principal landowner is George Pargiter Fuller esq: the soil is light brash, sub-soil rubble stone: the chief crops are wheat, barley and roots. These 2 places, with a population in 1911 of 53, are reputed to be extra-parochial for ecclesiastical purposes.

Letters received for Little Chalfield through Trowbridge, and for Cottles through Melksham. The nearest post, money order and telegraph office is at Atworth, about 1 mile distant.

The children of this place attend Atworth school.
