Great Wíshford 1850-1899

1855

Henry Martin, a lad about 14 years of age, was charged with stealing two gallons of turnips, the property of Mr. Josiah Trubridge, Wishford, on the 14th December last. They were valued at 6d. He was severely reprimanded by the Bench, and ordered to pay 6d, together with the value of the turnips, and the expenses, and in default 14 days imprisonment. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 27 January 1855**

1866

Wishford Using threatening language. A young man named George Ford, son of Mr. Ford, farmer, of Wishford, was brought up before Mr. W. Pinckney, at the Magistrates' Clerk's office, Salisbury, on Wednesday, having been apprehended on a warrant, charged with having threatened to shoot a young woman named Mary Stevens, a domestic servant in his father's house, on the 15th November. He was ordered to enter into his own recognizances of £50, and to find two sureties of £25 each, to keep the peace for twelve months. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 1 December 1866

1867

Salisbury. At Tuesday's Petty Sessions, Frederick Ford, farmer, of Wishford, was sentenced to two months' imprisonment, and Henry Ford, of the same place, ordered to find sureties for six months, for an aggravated assault on a gamekeeper named Samuel Edwards. **Western Gazette**, **14 June 1867**

1868

Henry Scott was fined 5s. and costs for assaulting a boy named Isaac Smith, Wishford. **Western** Gazette, 17 July 1868

1870

Salisbury, County Petty Sessions, Tuesday John Feltham, labourer, of Wishford, was summoned for using violent language to Jane Gray, widow, of the same parish. Case dismissed on defendant paying costs and promising not to molest Mrs. Gray again. Western Gazette, 11 March 1870

1873

Sessions, Tuesday Before Earl Radnor, Mr. J. Hussey, Mr. T. E. and Mr. George Morrison. Christopher Shergold, shepherd in the employ of Mr. Saunders, Wishford, pleaded guilty to having trapped a partridge, and was fined £1 and costs or (__) days' imprisonment. **Western Gazette**, 7 **February 1873**
