WISHFORD, or GREAT WISHFORD, is a township, parish and village on the Wiley stream, in Branch Hundred, Wilton Union, and parliamentary borough, South Wilts, 4 miles north of Wilton, 7 north-west of Salisbury, and 102 from London. The population, in 1851, was 378, and the number of acres 1,610. There is a church; the incumbent is the Rev. F. De Veil Williams, M.A.
