

## Post Office Directory Extract 1859 Great Wishford



WISHFORD, or GREAT WISHFORD, is a township, parish, village, and railway station, on the Great Western line, on the Wiley stream, in Branch hundred, Wilton union, and parliamentary borough, Salisbury county court district, South Wilts, 4 miles north of Wilton, 6 north-west of Salisbury, and 102 from London, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and deanery of Wylye. The population, in 1851, was 378, and the number of acres 1,610. The living is a rectory, annual value £472, with residence, in the gift of the Earl of Pembroke. The church of St. Giles is an ancient Gothic structure, partly covered with ivy, and has a square tower and 5 bells. The interior contains a very handsome monument to Sir Richard Grobham, formerly lord of the manor and who bequeathed, in 1628, four almshouses, allowing 6s. 6d. per week to each inmate. There is £250 bequeathed by Daniel Oland, the interest of which is applied to binding poor apprentices and purchasing them tools, with a present to 10 poor people at Christmas Eve. The Earl of Pembroke is lord of the manor, and the Rev. F. de V. Williams, M.A., is the incumbent. The earliest register bears date in 1558.
