Hankerton



Hankerton is a village and parish, in the Northern division of the county, Malmesbury union, hundred and county court district, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, rural deanery of Malmesbury North, and within Cricklade parliamentary borough, 4 miles west from Minety station, 89 from London, and 4 north-east from Malmesbury.

The church of the Holy Cross is an ancient fabric, in the Early English style, consisting of a nave and a fine lofty tower with 4 bells. The register dates from 1640. The living is a vicarage, value about £250 per annum, in the patronage of the rector of Crudwell, and held by the Rev William John Buckland, M.A., of Worcester College, Oxford.

Here is a National school, with residence for the mistress.

The Earl of Suffolk is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is various. The parish consists chiefly of pasture lands.

The population in 1861 was 383, whereof 108 are in Cloatley; the area is 2,150 acres; rateable value, £2,895.

Cloatley is a tithing, half a mile east; Bishoper 2 miles east
