Hankerton



Hankerton is a village and parish, 4 miles west from Minety station and 4 north-east from Malmesbury station, in the North Western division of the county, Malmesbury union, hundred, petty sessional division and county court district, rural deanery of Malmesbury, archdeaconry of Bristol and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

The church of the Holy Cross is an ancient fabric of stone, in the Early English style, consisting of a nave, south porch and a fine lofty western tower with 4 bells. There are sittings for 230 persons. The register dates from the year 1699. The living is a vicarage, gross yearly value from tithe rent-charge, with 14 acres of glebe and residence, £283, in the gift of the rector of Crudwell, and held since 1864 by the Rev William John Buckland, M.A., of Worcester College, Oxford.

The charities amount to £16 yearly.

The Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire J.P. is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is sandy and loamy; subsoil, clay and flints. The parish consists chiefly of pasture lands.

The area is 2,202 acres; rateable value, £2,541; the population in 1881 is 340.

Cloatley is a tithing half a mile east; Bishoper 2 miles west.
