Hankerton

Hankerton is a small village in the Chippenham Division of Wilts, Union, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District of Malmesbury, and Diocese of Bristol, and is 4 miles from Minety and 4 from Malmesbury.

The register of the Church of Holy Cross dates from 1699. The living, a vicarage, net income £135, with residence, is in the gift of Mrs Adkin.

The principal landowners are the Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire (Lord of the Manor), Mr J R Randolph and Mr A J Murray Shireff.

Area, 2,203 acres; rateable value, £2,252; population in 1911, 240.

LETTERS arrive from Malmesbury and are dispatched at 12.45 and 6 pm. Charlton, two miles distant, is the nearest Telegraph Office.

Cloatley, half- mile east, a tithing. **Bishoper**, 2 miles west
