Death of Rev Knight-Adkin

Honorary Canon of Bristol Cathedral

The death occurred at his residence, 69 Alma Road, Clifton, on Monday, of Canon Henry Kenrick Knight-Adkin, in his 77th year.

Mr Knight-Adkin on being ordained a deacon in 1879 was appointed curate of the Church of St John's, Cheltenham. In 1880 he became a priest and remained at Cheltenham until 1884. He was then instituted Vicar of Cold Salperton, Gloucester, where he stayed until 1897. For the next two years he occupied the position of Public Preacher in the Gloucester diocese, before being appointed rector of Crudwell. During his 10 years there he was made also Vicar of Hankerton.

Relinquishing that benefice in 1910 he became rector of Horfield. His 11 years work in Bristol earned for him the admiration and respect of the citizens generally. He also took a prominent part in Mission work.

Upon his retirement from Horfield he devoted himself to the Board of Missions and other works of a religious nature. In 1922 he was appointed an honorary Canon of the Bristol Cathedral, succeeding the Rev Dr Horsefield, late vicar of St Silas.
