Hankerton



Hankerton is a small scattered village 4 miles west from Minety station, 89 from London, and 4 north-east from Malmesbury, in Malmesbury union and hundred, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, deanery of Malmesbury North, and Cricklade parliamentary borough, North Wilts.

The living is a vicarage, in the patronage of the rector of Crudwell, and held by the Rev George Staunton Simcockes, M.A. The church of the Holy Cross is an ancient and large fabric, in the Early English style, consisting of a fine lofty tower, 4 bells, a nave and chancel.

Here is a National school.

The population in 1851 was 371, whereof 93 is in Cloatly; the area in acres, 2,150; rateable value £2,805.

The Earl of Suffolk is lord of the manor.

Cloatly is a tithing, half a mile east; **Flisteridge** and **Braden Brook,** 1 mile north-east; **Bishopers**, 2 miles east **Dorments**, 1 mile east. **Bullocks** is a farm.
