In the name of God Amen The Eighteenth day of January 1661 according to the Church of England I **William Williams** of Clotly in the parish of Hankerton and in the County of Wilts Gent being of perfect memory and remembrance praised be god doe make and ordaine this my last Will and testament in manner and forme as follows

First I bequeath my Soule into the hands of Almighty God my maker hoping that through the meritorious death and passion of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and Redeemer to receive Free pardon and forgiveness of all my sinns and as for my Bodie to be buried in Christian buriall at the discretion of my Executrix hereafter mentioned

Item I give to my Three Sonnes Twentie foure pounds which is due from the Right Honorable the Earle of Berkshire to be equally devided amongst them

Item I give to my daughter **Elizabeth** the Thirtie pounds which is due from the Earle of Berkshire

Item I give to my Sister **Katherine Evens** & my Brother **Henry Williams** the summe of five shillings a peece which belongs to the debt of Twenty foure pounds due from the Earle of Berkshire

Item the rest of all my goods and chattells I give to my beloved wife whom I make my whole and sole Executrix hoping that she will take care for any paying any Legacies by me given in this my last will and Testament revoking all other wills

Item I make **Doctor Quie** {?} and Mr **Richard Poole** of Newington my overseers to take care of these legacies according to my Will and doe give them five shillings a peece
