## Hannington



This village has a station on the Highworth branch of the G.W.R., is 2 miles from Highworth, and 7 from Swindon, and is in the Swindon Division of Wilts, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District of Swindon, Union of Swindon and Highworth, and Diocese of Bristol. The register of the Church of St. John the Baptist dates from 1571; and the living is a vicarage of the net annual value of £200. Area, 2,518 acres; rateable value, £3,247; population, 239. Letters arrive from Highworth, which is the nearest Money Order and Telegraph Office, and the postbox is cleared at 6.15 p.m. weekdays. Postal orders are issued and paid.

HANNINGTON WICK is a hamlet 1 mile south.
