

Kellys Directory Extract 1931 Heddington



Heddington is a parish 3 miles south from Calne terminal station and 7 north from Devizes station by road, on the Great Western railway, in the Chippenham division of the county, hundred, rural district county court district and petty sessional division of Calne, rural deanery of Avebury (Avebury portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The church of St. Andrew is a building of stone in the Perpendicular style, consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave of three bays, aisles, vestry, north porch and a western embattled tower, with pinnacles, containing 5 bells: the east window is stained, and there are tablets to the Revs. James Thomas du Boulay, ob. 1836, and Henry Rogers M.A. ob. 1669; a floor stone to the Rev. Francis Rogers, ob. 1800, and a brass to George John Majendie M.A. ob. 1842: there are 180 sittings. The register dates from the year 1538. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £357, including 15 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of Roger E. Money-Kyrle esq. and held since 1926 by the Rev. Edward James Clifton O.B.E., hon. C.F. The Mission Room, built about 1894 by Miss Ann Hayward Clark, will seat about 60 persons. There is a Wesleyan chapel. The charities consist of the second poor's house of three cottages, bringing in £9 9s. yearly; Nicholas Pearse's of £50, left in 1821, and invested in Consols: Sarah Peplar's bequest of £300, founded in 1837, and invested in Consols: Brice Pearse's of £48 13s. 2d. left in 1840 and invested in Consols: Isaac Clark's of £50 in Consols, founded in 1855, and Mrs Majendie's ecclesiastical charity of £310 4s. in Consols, the total income being £30 10s. 8d. The ancient earthwork, called the "Wansdyke," separating the Belgic and aboriginal tribes, and commencing on the banks of the Severn, passed through Spye Park in the adjoining parish of Chittoe, and proceeded thence to the north of Heddington; the Roman road from Bath to Marlborough also ran through this parish, and followed for some distance the track of the Wansdyke. Near Heddington was Verlucio, a Roman station, and coins have been found in the ruins of ancient buildings in the vicinity. The principal landowner is Roger E. Money-Kyrle esq. who is lord of the manor. The soil is clay; subsoil chalk. The land is chiefly in pasture, but corn is grown. The area is 1,697 acres; the population in 1921 was 257 in the civil and 395 in the ecclesiastical parish.
