Chevalier of the Legion of Honour Aged 23 Years. Son of the late  Reginald William Henry Warneford, grandson of the  late Rev. T.L.J. Warneford Chaplain to the Forces in India Gt Nephew of  the late  Rev. Canon Warneford of Warneford Place. He was honoured by his King  with  the Victoria Cross &amp; by the French Nation with the Medal of the Legion of  Honour for pursuing &amp; destroying single handed a Zeppelin Airship ne  Ghent  in Belgium on 7<sup>th</sup> June 1915. He was killed 10 days later when flying in  Paris  on 17<sup>th</sup> June 1915 &amp; lies buried in Brompton Cemetery where the Nation  has  shown ots gratitude &amp; recognition of his great achievement in the erection  of a Memorial by Public Subscription</p>
