On the 1st inst at the Independent chapel, Highworth, by the Rev. Tomas Gilbert, Mr. Richard Bainge, farmer of Marston Maizey, Wilts, to Mary Salt of Castle Eaton, in the same county. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 8 November 1851**

1856

At the house of his father-in-law, Highworth, Wilts, aged 49, John Tucker, Esq. of Westham Abbey, Essex. **Gentleman's Magazine, September 1856, Page 390**

1857

1860

February 18, at Highworth, at a very advanced age, and after a long and lingering illness, highly respected, Mrs. Howe, for many years an inhabitant of that town. **Swindon Evening Advertiser, 5 March 1860**

March 12, 1863 At All Saints' Knightsbridge, Edgar Hanbury, Esq., of Highworth, Wiltshire, fourth son of Robert Hanbury, Esq., of Poles, Hertfordshire, to Caroline Frances, youngest daughter of the late Colonel T. July 25th, 1863 At his residence, Westhill, Highworth, Wilts, Captain J. S. W. Johnson, RN, MP. He was a son of the Rev. 1870

1877
