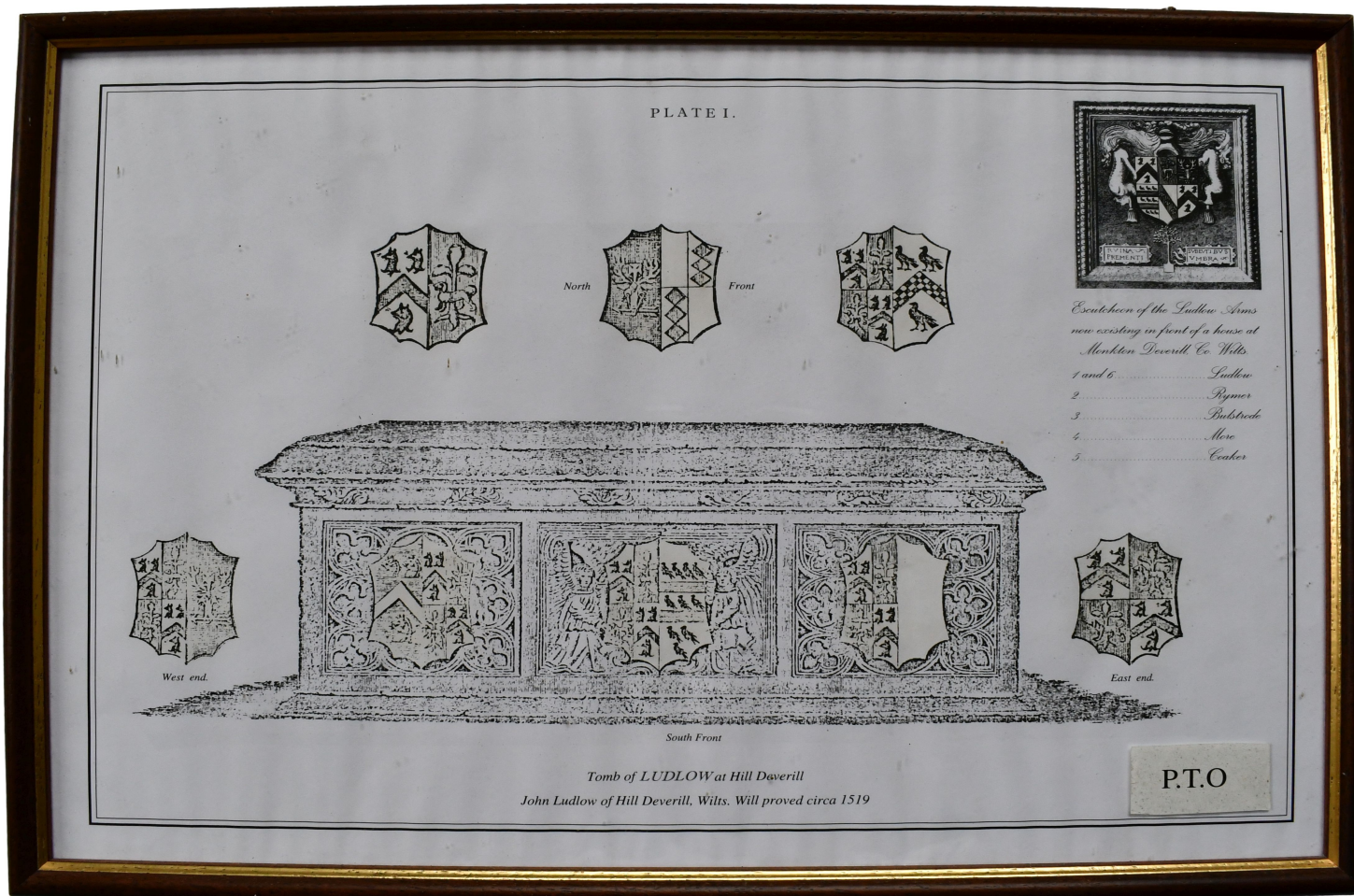


Longbridge Deverill

BLAZON.

Quarterly 1st, LUDLOW: Argent, a chevron between three martlets erased sable.
 2nd, RYMER: Gules, in front of an oak tree eradicated Or, a greyhound passant argent, gorged with a collar sable, studded with the second.
 3rd, BULSTRODE: Sable, a stag's head cabossed argent, between the antlers Or, a pine of the East, placed above the nostrils by an arrow in fess, point to the sinister; also gold feathers of the same; the nostrils dropping blood proper.
 4th, MOORE: Argent, two bars azure, between ten martlets, 4, 3, and 3, gules.
 CREST: A dam martlet couped sable.

George Ludlow, High Sheriff for Wilts.—EORNE, 2nd daughter of Lord Windsor, 1667. Will proved 4th Feb. 1680. Inq. p.m. 22 Elizabeth.

Mary Ludlow, married Richard Stroppe, of Castle Cosho, Wilts. (Vide pedigree of Lord Stroppe.)

1st wife, Bridget, daughter and sole heiress of Henry Colver, of Maywood, co. Dorset. Buried at Hill Deverill, Sept. 1567.

2nd wife, MARGARET, daughter of Henry Manning, of Down, co. Kent, M.P. for Windsor, 1608. Administration, 1634. Inq. p.m. 1 Charles I.

THOMAS LUDLOW, of Dinton—JANE, daughter of Thomas, and sister of Sir Gabriel Pye, Knt. of Bayton, in the parish of Fisherton St. Mers. Will proved 9th July 1650.

ANNA, married Thomas Hall, of London, gent.

MARGARET, married Robert Vass, of Otham, Hants.

JANE, married Nicholas Basset.

MARY, married Hugh Ryley, gent.

URSULA, married Thomas, son of Sir John Bouch, Knt., Dorset.

Sir Henry Ludlow, Knt., born at Maiden Bradley, 1592. Matriculated at Brasenose Coll., Oxford, 1613 Oct. 1607, aged 15. Graduated as B.A. 6th Feb. 1609. High Sheriff for Wilts, 1632. M.P. 1642. Died intestate; buried at St. Andrew's, Holborn, 1st Nov. 1643. Administration of effects granted to his eldest son, General Edmund Ludlow, 20th March 1643, which grant being subsequently revoked, a new grant was made to Nathaniel Ludlow, 9th Feb. 1667, another son of deceased.

Edmund Ludlow, of Kingston Deverill, bapt. at Hill Deverill, 25th June 1595. Matriculated at Brasenose Coll., Oxford, 19th June 1610, aged 14. M.P. 1632. Will proved 23rd Nov. 1666. Married Katherine, daughter of Sir Francis D'Ampier, Knt. Died without issue.

Hamphrey, matriculated at B. C. Oxon, 1611. Living at Allington, 1623.

Benjamin Ludlow, killed at the siege of Corfe Castle Administration 1648. Edmund Ludlow, 2nd son of Benjamin, of Baling, co. Middlesex. Will proved 4th Feb. 1691. Married Douglas, dau. of Sir Francis D'Ampier, Knt.

George Ludlow, born at Dinton, 7th Sept. 1653. Died young.

GABRIEL LUDLOW, bapt. at Dinton, 10th Feb. 1657. Called to the Bar, 16th Oct. 1670. Elected a Bachelor, 2nd Nov. 1671. Particular Bachelor of the Duchy of Lancaster possessions in Norfolk, Suffolk, and Cambridge. Patent dated 6th of Charles I. Resigned the office 29th June 1679. Deputy Ranger of Salford Forest, 1678.

PHILIP, said Baycliffe to Sir James Thorne, 1658. ROBERT LUDLOW, bapt. at Dinton, 17th March 1659. Matriculated at Balliol College, Oxford, 16th June 1670. Deputy-Governor of Massachusetts and of Connecticut. Compiled the first Connecticut Code of Laws, printed in 1673. Married issue. Vide Ludlow's Memoirs (also George Ludlow's will proved 1st August 1664).

ANNE LUDLOW, bapt. at Dinton, 5th July 1601. Married at Dinton, 8th July 1613.

THOMAS LUDLOW, bapt. at Dinton, 2nd March 1623. Married at Warminster, 19th Feb. 1624. Inventory taken 10th June 1645.

EDMUND LUDLOW, Lieut-General, the celebrated Republican, born at Maiden Bradley, 1612. Matriculated at Trinity College, Oxford, 10th Sept. 1628, aged 17. Graduated as B.A. 14th Nov. 1628. Admitted to the Inner Temple, 13th June 1629. M.P. for Wilts. High Sheriff, 1643. Was one of the judges on the trial of Charles I. Commander of the forces in Ireland. Married Elizabeth Thomas, of Yeave Castle, co. Monmouth. Author of Ludlow's Memoirs. Died as a exile at Veray, 1660. Left no issue. Vide statement at Veray.

ROBERT LUDLOW, 2nd son of Sir Henry Ludlow, born 1601. Matriculated at Magdalen College, Oxford, 12th July 1618, aged 15. Died a prisoner of war, 1643. Vide Ludlow's Memoirs.

THOMAS LUDLOW, Vide Ludlow's Memoirs.

NATHANIEL LUDLOW, bapt. at Maiden Bradley, 14th April 1624. Administrator of his father Sir Henry Ludlow's estate. Executor to his mother, his uncle Edmund, and his brother Philip. Will proved 12th May, 1701.

FRANCIS LUDLOW, bapt. at Maiden Bradley, 15th April 1628. Buried at Maiden Bradley, 6th Oct. 1628. Died at sea, 15th August 1650. Administration, 14th Oct. 1650. Buried in Westminster Abbey.

PHILIP LUDLOW, bapt. at Maiden Bradley, 15th April 1628. Died at sea, 15th August 1650. Administration, 14th Oct. 1650. Buried in Westminster Abbey.

HENRY LUDLOW, bapt. at Maiden Bradley, 19th Feb. 1632. Ancestor of Lord Ludlow. The peerage became extinct in 1842.

ELIZABETH, Cal. Kempton, Somerset. Vide Ludlow's Memoirs.
