Other Significant Information	
<p>Charles Beckett enlisted at Salisbury with the Wiltshire Regiment. He was given the rank of Private & a service number of 26079. Lance Corporal Charles Beckett was killed in action on 9th April, 1917. Records show he was attached to 2nd Battalion, Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire) Regiment.</p>	
<p>The Grave Registration Report on CWGC, states that he died "C C 13 April 1917"</p>	
<p>Lance Corporal C. Beckett was originally buried in a smaller or isolated cemetery which was unmaintainable & was at a later date exhumed & reburied in an established War Grave Cemetery where the CWGC could ensure proper commemoration. In Lance Cpl. Beckett's case he was reburied in Wancourt British Cemetery, France – Plot No. VI. G. 22. Lance Corporal Beckett's original grave was identified by a cross bearing his name. His death is acknowledged by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission.</p>	
<p>The CWGC lists Lance Corporal C. Beckett, 26079, 2nd Bn., Wiltshire Regiment as the husband of C. Beckett, of Corner House, High St., Hindon, Salisbury, Wilts.</p>	
<p>There is no age given on the CWGC website. Charles Beckett married 1908 to Lydia Anna Moxham. The WWI Pensions Record Card confirms this Charles matches the above service number 26079. The War Gratuity also confirms that Lydia was his wife.</p>
