

Other Significant Information

Gunner Edwin Lucas Baker was originally buried in a smaller or isolated cemetery that was unmaintainable by the CWGC & was later exhumed & reburied in Cabaret-Rouge British Cemetery, Souchez, France – Grave No. XV. K. 19., where the Commission could ensure proper commemoration. Gunner Baker's original grave was identified & marked by a Cross. His death is acknowledged by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission

The CWGC lists Gunner Edwin Lucas Baker, 155867, "A" Bty. 317th Bde., Royal Field Artillery as the son of Samuel and Bessie Baker, of Hindon, Wilts; husband of Annie Baker, of 2 Alexandra Terrace, Tisbury, Wilts

Married at Zion Hill Church, Tisbury on 11 June 1910 to Annie Hibberd
