Homington 1850-1899

1857

Rev. Henry Smith Pollard, clerk, M.A. formerly incumbent of Edlington, near Horncastle, and now vicar of Coombe Bissett, near Salisbury, has been licensed to the Perpetual Curacy of the adjoining parish of Homington, void by the resignation of the Rev. William Biscoe, clerk, on the nomination of the Dean and Chapter of Sarum.

1860

Thursday last, notwithstanding the inclemency of the weather, was a day of rejoicing in the little village of Homington, when the old church, which has for the last eight months been under repairs, was re-opened by the Lord Bishop of Salisbury. **Reading Mercury, Saturday, 15 December 1860**

It is understood that the Rev. Thomas Luck Kingsbury, M.A., rector of Kingston Deverill, Wilts, and Canon of Salisbury Cathedral, is to succeed to the benefice of Coombe Bissett and Homington, near Salisbury, vacant by the death of the Rev. H.S. Pollard. **Western Gazette, 9 January 1885**
