

An Earnest Appeal on behalf of the Parish of Homington near Salisbury

The Incumbent of Homington is obliged to make known for the second time the deplorable condition of his Church at Homington.

In the first Appeal which he circulated throughout the Diocese in the early part of the present year, he publicised Mr Wyatt's official report; and the opinion he then expressed of its dilapidated and neglected condition has been amply confirmed by a more careful survey of the entire building in the month of April, with a view to obtain a correct estimate for putting the Church into a proper state of repair. The architect pronounces it to be in a worse state then before, and not altogether, in many parts, free from danger. The restoration cannot be deferred to another year without risking the safety of the entire Church.

The value of the living is at present only £50 per annum; the population is 200, and consists entirely of labourers, with the exception of one tenant farmer.

The cost of putting the Church into a proper repair cannot be estimated at less than £800. The Incumbent has already received some liberal contributions, and kind promises of assistance in furthering the holy work, especially from the Right Hon. The Earl of Radnor and the Viscount Folkestone, which encourage him to hope that funds will not be wanting to complete the good work so long and so urgently needed.
