Toll case - Implements of Husbandry

Richard Poulden was summoned by Mr John Brown, of Homington, for having on Monday, the 14th ult., illegally demanded and taken toll on two loads of hurdles and sheep cribs, passing from one part of his farm to another. The case had been adjourned from this day fortnight. Mr King, of Blandford, who appeared for the turnpike trust, said that in cases where hurdles were merely being conveyed from one part of a farm to another, for actual use, the trustees would not hereafter demand toll. – Mr Whatman said Mr Brown would be quite satisfied with that undertaking.
