Man killed at Hendon: Another Badly Injured

One man was killed and another is in hospital in a serious condition as a result of an aeroplane crash near the R.A.F. Aerodrome at Hendon on Saturday night. The plane, a "civil" machine, fell in a field adjoining the aerodrome. The engine was buried in the earth and the wings were buckled.

The dead airman was later identified as George Villiers, of Homington House, Salisbury, and the injured man as Henry Winch (24), a lieutenant in the Scots Guards. He is a step-son of Lady Newborough. He has been very interested in flying for some time, and a short while ago gained his flying certificate.

Mr Villiers was a nephew of Viscount Wimborne and of Captain F. E. Guest.
