Homington is a township and parish in the Hundred of Cawden and Cadworth and Alderbury Poor-law Union, Wilton parliamentary Union, south Wilts, distant 4 miles south-west-by-south from Salisbury, and 99 from London. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the presentation of the dean and Chapter of Salisbury cathedral. The church is dedicated to the Virgin Mary. Population, in 1852, was 176, with 1, 340 acres.
