I Mark Foulkes of the Parish of Horningsham in the County of Wilts do make publish & declare this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say – after my funeral expences & just debts paid I leave and bequeath all my household furniture of whatever description it may consist together with my stock of Cattle hay and crops of every kind together with all those debts that are due to me for her use and service to my Wife

I also recommend will and devise that whatever may remain from these bequests after my said wife's decease may become the property of Phillis Sutton But I would have it understood that my wife is not to be molested or interrupted and to have the full benefit of the property in case of illness or misfortune

In order that this my last will and testament may be carried into due effect I nominate constitute and appoint Mr John Moody executor or Trustee
