**For the perpetual memory** (statement recorded in the year 1760 - Baptisms)

Given by Gabriel Thistethwayte Clerk, formerly the unworthy Rector of this church the sum of Ten pounds to the parish of Huish to be solely paid or lett out by the Rector and Churchwardens for the use and benefit of the Parish Clark and his Successor for ever. For which he is to Toll or Ring a Bell every Sunday in the Afternoon about One a Clock, beginning the last Sunday in Aprill and so on every Sunday ending the first Sunday in August, to call all the Children of Huish and Oare that are fitt to be Calechised and there to hear and bath from this Calechism of the Church of England till devine Service in the afternoon begins, and so perfect them for for the Minister and for Confirmation by the Bishop when thereunto Called.

Now if this said Parish Cark on his Successor shall hereafter refuse or neglect to do this office, it is the will of the Donor that, That year he or they so refuses or neglects, the Rector or the Churchwardens shall take the benefitt of this Gift from him on them, and give it that year to the poor of this parish.

This is desired by the Donor to be fairly Recorded in your Parish Register in perpetuam rei memoriam.

**1880**

Memorandum

On the 18<sup>th</sup> January 1880 several sharp shocks of earthquake were felt at Huish Rectory just before and after 5 a.m. The house was shaken & dining room window was rattled violently as if being shaken down The chrck was felt at the Blacksmith's also at Oare, Pewsey, Froxfield and Wilton Nr Salisbury.

About 2 years before one of the labourers while walking to Oare about 6. a.m. said he felt a shiver and the ground shaken much.
