Hullavington

HULLAVINGTON is a village and parish, with a station on the Swindon and Severn tunnel section of the Great Western railway, 5 miles south-west from Malmesbury, 7 north-by-west from Chippenham and 94 from London, in the North Western division of the county, Malmesbury union, county court district, petty sessional division and hundred (except the tithing of Surrendel, which is in the hundred of Chippenham), and in the rural deanery of Malmesbury, archdeaconry of North Wilts and diocese of Bristol. The church of St Mary is a building of stone, consisting of chancel, side chapel, nave of three bays, aisles, south porch and an embattled western tower, rebuilt in 1880, and containing 2 bells: the porch, arches, columns and other parts are Transition Norman and the north aisle has very good Early English windows: there are slight remains of 12th century glass: the church was restored in 1871, and in 1907 the north aisle and Bradfield chapel were restored and an organ chamber erected: there are 240 sittings. A lych-gate was erected in the churchyard in 1807, by Meredith Meredith-Brown esq. JP in memory of his wife. The register dates from the year 1694. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £180, including 84 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of Eton College, and held since 1905 by the Rev John Charles Ramsay, of St Bees: in the south aisle hangs a portion of a chasuble of brown satin, embroidered in gold and silver thread, the date being about 1490-1500; in the centre is a representation of Our Saviour on the Cross, with an angel on each side receiving the blood in a chalice; the rest is covered with figures of saints, cherubim and fleurs-de-lys. Here are Baptist, Congregational and Primitive Methodist chapels. Green's charity amounts to £4 5s yearly, of which £2 5s is for the education of poor children. The manorial rights and rectorial tithes, as well as most of the land, belong to Eton College; Lieut-Col Sir Audley Dallas Neeld bart. CB MVO is lessee under the College. The soil is brashy, on rock. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats. The area is 3,303 acres; rateable value £4,820; population in 1911 was 552.

SURRENDEL is a tithing, 1½ miles west.
