

Post Office Directory of Wiltshire Extract 1855 Hullavington



HULLAVINGTON is a township, village, and parish, in Malmesbury Hundred and Union, Cricklade parliamentary borough, North Wilts, 5 miles south-west from Malmesbury, and 7 north-by-west from Chippenham. The living is a vicarage, value £220, including 80 acres of glebe land, in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, and the gift of Eton College; the Rev. William Carter is the incumbent. The church, dedicated to St. Michael, is a large and handsome structure. with square tower; the interior more particularly shows marks of considerable antiquity. There are three Dissenting places of worship - viz., Baptist, Independent and Primitive Methodist; also a school on the National system. The area is 3,121 acres; and the population, according to the last census, was 708, including Surrendel, a tithing, with 23 inhabitants, 1½ miles east. Gorse Brook, or Gauze Brook, is half a mile north-west; Bradfield, half a mile north-east. Dunby, Fir Leaze, and Marshfield, are farms.
