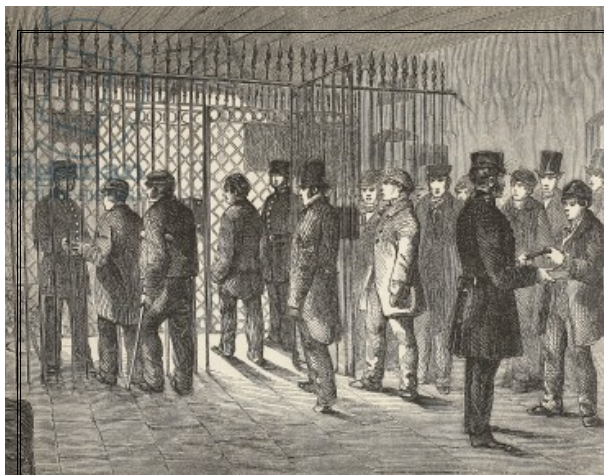

Keevil

1700-1799



1782

Monday evening Farmer Cox, of Keevil, on his return home from Devizes Green fair, was attacked, about a mile and a half from his own house, by a single highwayman, who robbed him of upwards of thirty three guineas in bills and cash, which he had that day received for cheese, and rode off. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal 4 November 1782**

1783

Monday last were committed to Fisherton gaol, Matthew Magarth and Arthur Kenney, two soldiers in the 62nd Regiment of Foot charged with robbing James Wiltshire, of Keevill, labourer, on the highway between Bradford and Holt, of between twenty and thirty shillings in silver and halfpence. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette 13 February 1783**

1784

STOLEN or Strayed, on Wednesday the 9th of June 1783 [?], out of the Church yard of Keevil, in the county of Wilts. A strong PONEY GELDING, of a mouse colour, has a small scar in the forehead, a notch cut in one of his ears, and is a very fast trotter. Whoever will give intelligence of the said poney to Swithin Shepherd, of Keevil aforesaid, so that he may be recovered, shall be paid all charges, and handsomely rewarded. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal 19 July 1784**
